Product Servicing

This product cannot be serviced at the component level. In case of a fault, replace the UB-R05 itself.

Wireless LAN Connection

Be aware of the following matters if using a wireless LAN connection.

The influence on the environment of radio wave radiation

This product is equipped with a certified Radio Frequency module for low-power data communication systems in accordance with the Radio Act. The electromagnetic energy radiated from this product is suppressed so that it is much lower than that of radio equipment like cell phones.

Under some situations and in certain environments, the use of this product is sometimes limited by the owner of the building or a representative with responsibility for the group. If you do not understand the radio device usage policy in a specific group or environment, such as an airport, ask permission before using this product.

The influence on the human body of radio wave radiation

The output power radiated from the Radio Frequency module that can be installed in this product is much lower than the radiation limit specified in the safety standard. However, it is best to avoid allowing this product to contact your body during usual operation. When using this product, be especially careful not to touch the antenna on the back.

Cautions about Interference

- This product generates, uses, and can radiate radio frequency energy and, if not installed and used in accordance with the instruction manual, may cause harmful interference to radio communications.
- Perform adjustments so that the unit does not use the same channel as other wireless LAN devices nearby.
- Keep the following points in mind when using the Wireless LAN unit in an environment with devices that generate radio interference, such as a kitchen microwave.

Install the printer as far away from devices that generate radio interference as possible.

Use channels that are away from the frequency bands that may cause radio wave influence.

Install a shielding plate between the printer and a device that generates radio interference.

Select either 2.4 GHz or 5 GHz, whichever is free from radio wave interference.

When setting the auto-channel of the access point, be sure to set it so it does not generate radio interference.

• If the Radio Frequency module in this product does cause harmful interference to radio or television reception, the user is encouraged to try to correct the interference by one or more of the following measures:

Reorient or relocate the receiving antenna for radio/TV.

Increase the separation between this product and radio/TV.

Connect this product to an outlet different from the outlet the TV or radio is connected to.

Consult your dealer or an experienced radio/TV technician for help.

Cautions Regarding Wireless LAN Connections

Because not all the combinations of the product and wireless LAN devices have been checked for operation, the operation of the product in combination with all the wireless LAN devices is not guaranteed.

Cautions about Security

Important Cautions about Your Privacy Protection

The advantage of using a wireless LAN over a LAN cable is that, because information is exchanged using radio signals, you can easily connect to the network if you are within range of the radio signals. A disadvantage of this is that within a certain range, the electromagnetic signals can pass through barriers such as walls, so that if security countermeasures are not implemented in some way, problems such as the following may occur.

Communicated data can be intercepted

A third party may be able to receive wireless transmissions without authorization, and they could obtain personal information from these transmissions such as IDs, passwords, or credit card numbers, or they could intercept the contents of personal e-mail messages.

Unauthorized access to the network

A third party could access an individual or intra-company network without permission and carry out any of the following activities.

- Retrieve personal data or other secret information (information leakage)
- Pose as another user and send inappropriate data (impersonation)
- Overwrite the contents of intercepted data and resend it (falsification)
- Introduce a computer virus which could cause data loss or system crashes (damage)

Security Settings

The wireless LAN card and access point have a security settings function to deal with these problems. You can reduce the possibility these problems will occur by performing security settings before use.



Even with security settings, there is a possibility the security can be breached using particular methods

We recommend that you have full understanding regarding security problems and perform security settings at your own judgment and liability.

Security settings are performed immediately after purchase (Initial setting: WPA2-PSK).

Limitations

You cannot stop the transmission of radio waves. If you need to stop the transmission of radio waves, turn off the TM printer.

Notes on Setting SSID (Service Set Identifier)

For protection of security, note the following precautions when setting the SSID.

- Change the SSID from the default setting.
- Do not set texts by which the owner can be identified as the SSID.

Notes on Setting Cryptographic Key

For protection of security, note the following precautions when setting the cryptographic key.

- Avoid using words on a dictionary as practicably as possible.
- Combine meaningless alphanumeric characters and symbols.
- Use texts consisted of at least 13 characters or more or of 20 characters or more if possible.

UB-R04 and UB-R05

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Product Overview

This chapter describes the features of this product, as well as the name and function of each part.

Features

The UB-R05 is an Ethernet and wireless LAN interface board for Epson TM printers.

The features of the UB-R05 are as follows.

Ethernet

- 10Base-T, 100Base-TX Ethernet
- Full duplex/half-duplex (Supports auto negotiation)
- Supports Auto-MDIX

Wireless LAN

- Compliance with IEEE802.11a/b/g/n/ac (Wi-Fi 5) wireless communication standards
- It supports infrastructure mode.
- It also supports WPA-PSK (AES), WPA2-PSK, and WPA2-Enterprise.

Network Function

- It supports TCP/IP protocol.
- It supports DHCP and APIPA.
- It supports ENPC and SNMP.
- It supports IPv4.
- It supports TLS1.2.

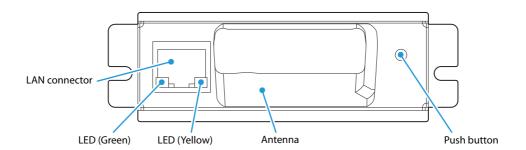
Setting

- The settings utility, EpsonNet Config, is available. Please download it from the Epson Web site and use it.
- You can use your Web browser to access EpsonNet Config (Web version) to browse and set network parameters.
- You can use the push button to factory reset and print settings.

Others

- It supports the XML print function (ePOS-Print) via HTTP/HTTPS communication.
- It supports IEEE802.3az (Energy Efficient Ethernet: EEE).

Parts Name and Function



LAN connector

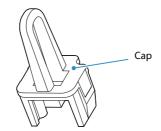
You can connect a LAN cable (RJ45 plug) to the LAN connector. When connecting the LAN cable, insert it all the way until you hear the click.



Do not insert a customer display cable, drawer kick cable, or a general public circuit cable into the LAN connector.

NOTE

The LAN connector has a cap to prevent the accidental insertion of a cable. Remove the cap to connect a LAN cable. We recommend keeping the cap installed when no LAN cable is connected.



LED

The two LEDs light up in the following situations.

The green LED: when the Ethernet link is established.

The yellow LED: when transmitting data.

Push button

The push button has the following functions.

Use tweezers or a similar fine-tipped object to push the push button.

Status sheet printing

When the TM printer is ready to print (with paper loaded and the power on), press and hold the push button for 3 seconds or longer to print the network parameters status.



If the DHCP or APIPA protocol is used to set an IP address, the assigned IP address will be printed. The IP address is not printed until it is assigned.

Factory reset function

While holding the push button, turn the printer's power on and continue to hold the push button until the factory reset start message is printed (approx. 10 seconds) to restore all settings to their factory default.



After turning the printer's power on, it can take about 15 to 20 seconds until the UB-R05 functions are enabled. If printing the status sheet, turn the printer on and wait for 20 seconds or longer, then press the push button.

However, when starting the printer for the first time after the factory reset, startup might take about 1 minute longer than usual in order to configure the default settings.

Setup

This chapter explains the network settings that are required before using this printer.

Either a wired or wireless LAN connection can be used.

Configuring the Settings via Ethernet

Use a LAN cable to connect the printer and the computer used to configure the settings to the same network. While configuring the settings, you can check the wireless LAN settings at any time, and easily correct any mistakes that might be made. We recommend using this method.

Configuring the Settings via Wireless LAN Connection

Connect the printer and the computer used to configure the settings to wireless LAN. If you make a mistake when configuring the settings, communication might not be possible. If that happens, you will not be able to check or reset the settings.

NOTE

If you also want to set up an access point, configure it in advance and check that it works properly.

Network Settings

There are three ways to configure the network for this product.

Method 1: Set up using EpsonNet Config

This method involves installing the network configuration tool, EpsonNet Config, on your computer for setting.

As it does not require any settings in advance to allow set up, you can easily perform set up using a computer already connected to the network.

To download EpsonNet Config, see "Download" on page 34.

Method 2: Set up using EpsonNet Config (Web version)

This method involves opening the Web application equipped in the UB-R05 from a Web browser to perform settings.

Because you specify the printer's IP address to open it, you need to set your computer to the same network segment as the printer.

With EpsonNet Config (Web version), you can set more items than with EpsonNet Config.

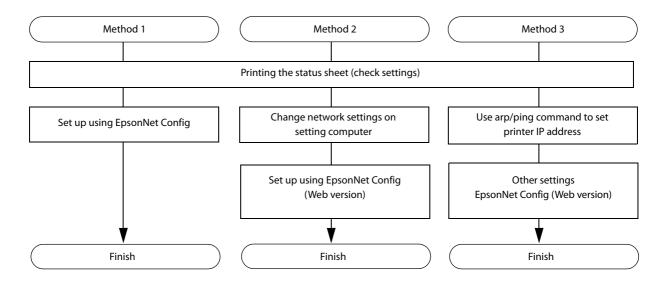
Method 3: Set up using arp/ping commands (for wired LAN connection only)

This method involves setting the printer's IP address in the setting computer's arp/ping commands, then using the setting tool to change the other settings.

The setting computer must be in the same segment as the printer. Also, settings can be done only when the printer's arp+ping IP setting is set to Enable.

Use EpsonNet Config or EpsonNet Config (Web version) for settings other than the IP address.

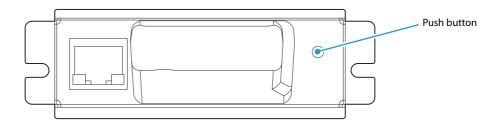
Setup Work flow



Printing the status sheet (Check Settings)

Turn on the printer equipped with the UB-R05, then after 20 seconds or longer, press and hold the push button to the right of the LAN connector for about 3 seconds to print the status sheet. Once printing starts, release the push button.

Use tweezers or a similar fine-tipped object to push the push button.

CAUTION

After turning the printer's power on, it can take about 15 to 20 seconds until the UB-R05 functions are enabled. Do not start pushing the push button during this time.

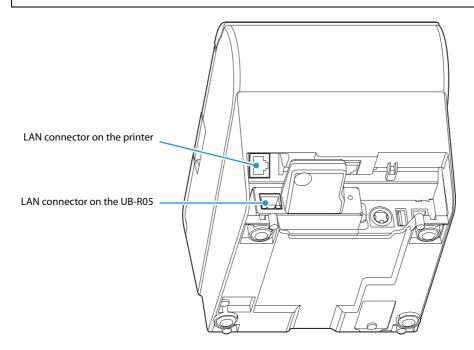
Connecting to Ethernet

This section describes how to connect a printer equipped with UB-R05 (the TM-T88VI is shown in the illustration) and the computer used to configure network settings to the same network via Ethernet.

- 1 Make sure the printer and the computer used to configure the settings are turned off.
- Remove the cap from the LAN connector on the UB-R05 mounted on the printer, and insert the LAN cable until you hear a click.

NOTE

There might be multiple LAN connectors, depending on the printer you are using. If you connect the LAN cable to the LAN connector on the printer, you will be unable to configure the UB-R05 settings correctly.



Connect the power cable to the printer, and turn on the printer.

4 Match the settings on the computer with the network settings indicated on the status sheet.

- By factory default, the printer is set to an IP address that is assigned by the DHCP server. If multiple IP addresses are in conflict on the same network, you will be unable to perform the setup procedure. Connecting to Wireless LAN

This section describes how to connect a printer equipped with UB-R05 (the TM-T88VI is shown in the illustration) and the computer used to configure network settings to the same network via wireless LAN.

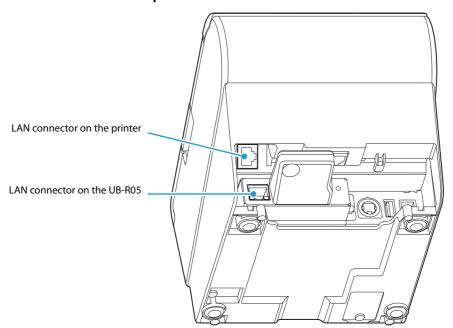
To connect to a network, use the TM printer's SimpleAP mode.

In SimpleAP mode, the printer functions as a simple access point. Therefore, you can connect to it in the same way as connecting to an access point.



Once wireless LAN network settings are performed, the printer will not start up in SimpleAP mode. If you want to start it up in SimpleAP mode, factory reset the UB-R05 that is mounted on the printer. For details about the factory reset procedure, see "Factory Reset" on page 26.

Make sure the printer and the computer used to configure the settings are turned off, and that no LAN cable is inserted into the LAN connector on the UB-R05 that is mounted on the printer.



2 Connect the power cable to the printer, and turn on the printer.

If DHCP is enabled, the IP address that is assigned will be printed automatically.

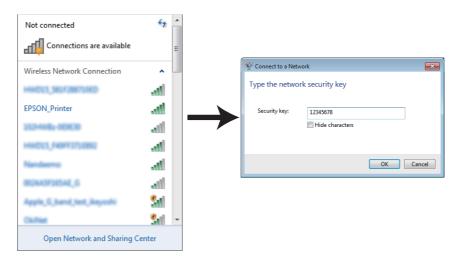
Example IP address

Activate Wireless Network Connection on the computer used to configure the settings, and select [EPSON_Printer] as the connection device on the screen that appears.

If the window to enter a pass phrase appears, enter "12345678". Default settings on printer are the following values.

Network mode	SimpleAP mode
SSID	EPSON_Printer
Pass phrase	12345678
IP Address	192.168.192.168

- For the setting method for the computer for setting, see the manual for your computer.
- By factory default, the printer is set to an IP address that is assigned by the DHCP server. If multiple IP addresses are in conflict on the same network, you will be unable to perform the setup procedure. Set up using EpsonNet Config

Select the target printer to set up from the EpsonNet Config device list.

If the network for the printer is still set to factory defaults, the printer's MAC address will be detected and shown in the device list even if the printer and the computer do not have the same network address.



- By factory default, the printer is set to an IP address that is assigned by the DHCP server. If multiple
 IP addresses are in conflict on the same network, you will be unable to perform the setup
 procedure. Therefore, make sure there is no conflict between IP addresses that are assigned by the
 DHCP server. If there is no DHCP server, a fixed IP address (192.168.192.168) will be set about 1
 minute after the power is turned on. Note that these processes are executed after connection by
 wired or wireless LAN is established.
- If DHCP is enabled, the IP address that is assigned will be printed automatically.
- 1 Connect the printer to the same network as the computer where you installed EpsonNet Config.
- Start up EpsonNet Config.

The tool automatically detects printers connected to the network and displays a list. It may take up to a minute for the printer to be displayed in the list. If it is not displayed, check that [Filter] is set to "(All)" or "Network-connected devices", then click [Refresh]. Or, select [Tools], then [Option], and check the settings of [Search Parameters].

- Select the target printer, then click [Configuration].

 If you cannot determine the target printer from the product name or the IP address, use the MAC address. You can check the printer's MAC address on the status sheet.
- Change the printer's settings based on the network setting information you received from the network administrator.

Select an item from the menu and change the setting.

Once you set the necessary items, click [Transmit].

The changed contents are sent to the printer and the printer settings are changed.



For details about EpsonNet Config, see the manual (operation guide) installed together with the tool or the online help.

Set up using EpsonNet Config (Web version)

Use the following method to open EpsonNet Config (Web version) to check and change settings.



- If performing set up using EpsonNet Config (Web version), you need to set the network settings of the device used for configuring settings to the same network segment as the printer to be connected to.
- By factory default, the printer is set to an IP address that is assigned by the DHCP server. If multiple
 IP addresses are in conflict on the same network, you will be unable to perform the setup
 procedure. Therefore, make sure there is no conflict between IP addresses that are assigned by the
 DHCP server. If there is no DHCP server, a fixed IP address (192.168.192.168) will be set about 1
 minute after the power is turned on. Note that these processes are executed after connection by
 wired or wireless LAN is established.
- If DHCP is enabled, the IP address that is assigned will be printed automatically.
- Connect the setting computer and the printer to the same network.
- Perform network settings on the computer so that it is in the same segment as the printer's IP address.

Subnet mask: Same subnet mask as the printer

IP address: Same segment (same network address) as the printer, different host address

Check the values set in the printer on the status sheet.

E.g.)		Printer	Setting computer
	Subnet mask	255.255.255.0	255.255.255.0
	IP address	192.168.192.168	192.168.192.2

Start up your Web browser and input the printer's IP address into the address field. E.g.) http://192.168.192.168



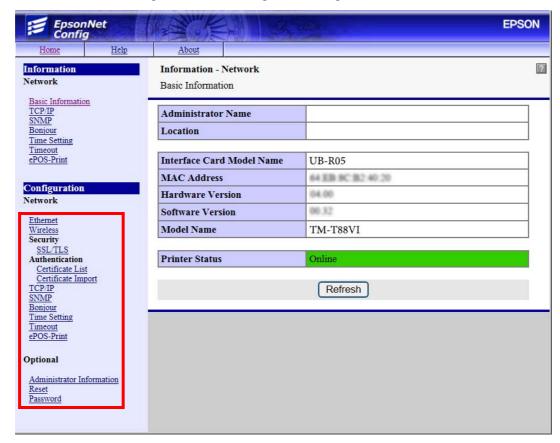
Under initial settings, when you access EpsonNet Config (Web version) from your browser, an authentication warning message may be displayed.

Input your user name and password on the authentication window.

- The user name is "epson", and the default password is the printer's serial number. You can find the serial number by performing a printer self-test, or by checking the manufacturing nameplate attached to the printer.
- You can change the password in the [Optional] setting menu, under [Password].

Change the settings based on the network setting information you received from the network administrator.

Select an item from [Configuration] and change the setting.



- After changing the necessary parameters, click the [Send] button. The changes are sent to the printer.
- **7** Click the [Reset] button on the Web page displayed after sending.

The sent contents are enabled.

Depending on the changes, such as the IP address, the connection with the setting computer may be cut and the EpsonNet Config window may not be displayed. To reconnect, you need to set the network settings of the setting computer to the same network segment as the printer for which settings were changed.

Set up using arp/ping commands (for wired LAN connection only)

You can change the printer's IP address by changing the ARP table (table of IP address and MAC addresses) managed by the OS on the setting computer.

Check that the setting computer is connected to the network in the same segment as the printer, and that the Set IP Address Using ARP + Ping for the UB-R05 is set to Enable. (The factory default is Disable.)

You can check the UB-R05 settings on the status sheet.

- Delete the IP address you want to set to the printer from the ARP table. arp -d (IP address)

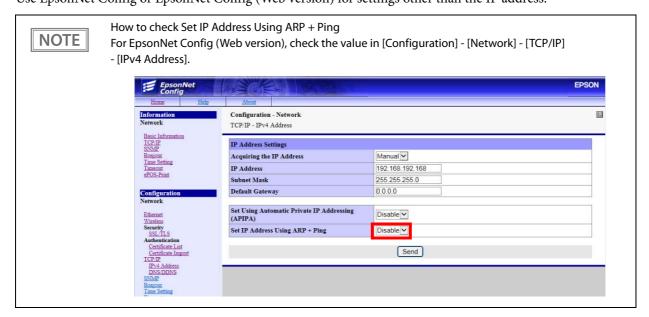
 E.g.) arp -d 192.168.0.10
- Add the printer's MAC address and the IP address you want to set to the ARP table. arp -s (IP address) (MAC address)

 E.g.) arp -s 192.168.0.10 00-26-AB-7B-00-00
- **3** Execute the ping command and enable settings.

ping (IP address you want to set) E.g.) ping 192.168.0.10

When a message like "Reply From 192.168.0.10: Bytes=32 Time < 10ms TTL=255" is displayed, the IP address setting is complete.

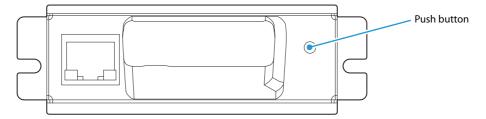
If this method is used to configure the settings, Set IP Address Using ARP + Ping is disabled. Use EpsonNet Config or EpsonNet Config (Web version) for settings other than the IP address.



Factory Reset

If you become unable to connect to the network, you can use the following procedure to initialize settings and restore the device to factory default.

- Turn off the printer's power.
- With the push button pressed, turn on the printer's power.
 Use tweezers or a similar fine-tipped object to push the push button.



Continue to hold the push button until the factory reset start message below is printed (approx. 10 seconds).

Resetting to Factory Default! Please Wait...

WARNING: DO NOT TURN OFF POWER

CAUTION

Do not turn the printer's power off until the factory reset is complete.

After about 20 seconds, a message notifying the completion of the reset is printed.

Reset to Factory Default Finished!

After the completion message, a status sheet is printed.

EpsonNet Config (Web version)

This section describes the items that can be displayed and set using EpsonNet Config (Web version), the Web application equipped in the UB-R05.

Information Menu

On the Information menu, you can check the following settings. For the details of each protocol or the settings other than the Information menu, check the Configuration menu.

Basic Information

You can check the items below.

(Administrator name, installation location, interface card model number, MAC address, hardware version, software version, connected printer model name, communication standard, network mode, SSID, wireless connection channel, wireless transmission speed, MAC address of the wireless connection access point, wireless radio wave strength, printer status)

TCP/IP

You can confirm TCP/IP protocol IP address settings.

SNMP

You can confirm SNMP protocol settings.

Bonjour

You can confirm Bonjour protocol settings.

Time Setting

You can confirm SNTP protocol time server settings.

Timeout

You can confirm LPR/Port9100 protocol Timeout duration settings.

ePOS-Print

You can check settings related to ePOS-Print.

Configuration Menu

On the Configuration menu, you can check and set the following items.

Ethernet

You can check and set the communication standard.

(Auto / 10Base-T Half Duplex / 10Base-T Full Duplex / 100Base-TX Half Duplex / 100Base-TX Full Duplex)

Wireless

You can check and set the following wireless settings.

- Settings of wireless transmission standards (Auto, 802.11b/g/n, 802.11a/n/ac)
- Network mode check
- SSID name input
- Encryption code setting (WPA2-PSK / WPA2-Enterprise / WPA-PSK (AES) / None)
- WPA Pre-Shared Key setting *WPA wireless password setting
- Authentication algorithm setting (OpenSystem / Shared key / Auto)
- Power saving function settings (Disable/Enable)

*If using "WPA2-Enterprise" in the above encryption method, the following settings are required.

- EAP authentication setting (EAP-TLS / PEAP-TLS / PEAP-MSCHAPv2)
- Client-signed certificate (Client-Signed Certificate1 / Client-Signed Certificate2 / Client-Signed Certificate3)
- User ID input
- Password input
- Server authentication setting (Disable / Enable)
- Server ID input

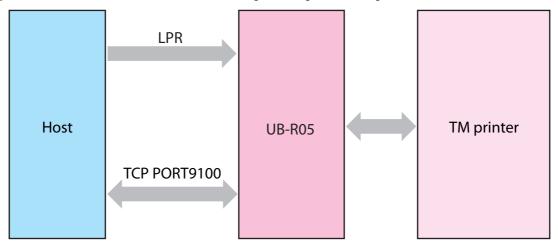

Printing to a TM printer

The UB-R05 is equipped with LPR protocol as a general printing protocol. It is easy to print by using LPR because the printing is also supported by the operating system.

The printer status cannot be acquired because LPR is one-way communication.

The UB-R05 supports direct printing via the TCP PORT9100. It is possible to control the printer directly by an application with the ESC/POS commands through writing and reading to the TCP PORT9100.

Monitoring of the ASB Status

The ASB status function of the printer is used for the UB-R05 to monitor the state of the printer. Therefore, when the transmission data from the application includes the command to nullify the ASB status function, the UB-R05 cannot control the state of the printer.

Take care not to transmit the command to nullify the ASB status function to monitor the state of the printer correctly by the UB-R05. Or retransmit the command that makes the ASB status function effective again.

Multiple connection requests

The UB-R05 permits up to 6 connection requests, regardless of the LPR/Port9100 protocol. However, only the first connection received can actually print to the TM printer, and any other connection requests will go into standby until the connection currently printing is closed.

In an environment where multiple connection requests occur, if the printing host does not close the connection and leaves it open even after printing is finished, or the connection is cut off due to some error without performing close processing, then all other connection requests will not be processed until the connection time-out occurs.

Arrange the application so that the connection is closed immediately after printing is completed.



You can set the connection time-out using the network configuration tool (EpsonNet Config). The default is 90 sec.

Automatic IP Address Assignment Protocols

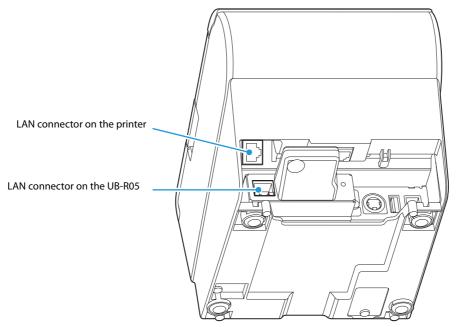
